Interesting History

RIVERHILL

Patience and Felicity Rogers ('Riverhill Shelties') lived at Riverhill House which is just outside Sevenoaks in Kent UK in their younger days, when they first had Shelties. They were quite involved in horses and racing at that time, and Felicity always maintained that it was their knowledge of horses which made them appreciate correct conformation in the Shelties, she said if you ever sat on the back of a horse with a straight shoulder you got a very uncomfortable ride!

The house and large estate was owned by the Rogers family and still is - the present owner, Edward is a direct descendant of the Sisters and their Brother David, being the Great Nephew of Patience and Felicity, and the Grandson of David and his wife Eve.

Sometime after the war the Sisters moved to a lovely house in Sussex - Knockbridge, Icklesham, Nr. Rye UK, We went there several times, they used our champion Felthorn Beachcomber and we went to look at the puppies. Whenever we went we were given lunch and Felicity always asked Dick to carve the meat. They were always very welcoming and it was so interesting to listen to them, they were so knowledgeable about Shelties and knew pedigrees from generations back.

When Patience died, Felicity moved back to Riverhill, she lived in one of the Riverhill Cottages on the estate, and at the same time Mary and Ivy Davis (Monkswood) lived in another cottage on the estate, so they were a great help to Felicity as she had a few dogs when she moved back, but by that time she was getting on in years and didn't do any more breeding or showing, so she just enjoyed having her dogs for company.

It was 1931 when Felicity Rogers had her first Sheltie. Felicity and Patience then bred their first litter of Shelties in 1932 and their first Champion (Ch Riverhill Rufus) was crowned in 1935. They went on to breed 29 'Riverhill' Champions over the years. Felicity first awarded CC's in 1937 and Judged Crufts in 1939, 1955, and 1960. Felicity also visited USA and judged there at the Lexington KC show on May 8th 1960 (the day after the National Show where the Judge was Mary Gray) attracting an entry of 130 Shelties.

Felicity also wrote a very interesting book about the breed ('All About The Shetland Sheepdog') in 1974, which was revised in 1980. Ed.



Riverhill House is a <u>Grade II listed rag-stone Queen Anne manor house</u> located on the southern edge of <u>Sevenoaks</u> in <u>Kent</u>, <u>England</u>. The house and estate, of 130 acres (0.53 km²), are located directly to the south of <u>Knole Park</u>, near to the villages of <u>Sevenoaks Weald</u> and <u>Underriver</u>. The gardens are occasionally open to the public, mainly in the spring.

Originally built on the site of a <u>Tudor</u> farmstead in 1714, John Rogers purchased Riverhill House and estate in 1840. A keen <u>botanist</u> and a contemporary of <u>Charles Darwin</u> purchased the property because of its sheltered location and <u>lime-free soil</u>. Rogers was an early member of the <u>Royal Horticultural Society</u> and a patron of <u>Victorian</u> plant-hunters.

The house has been enlarged and improved since then, by subsequent generations of the Rogers family up until 1900. Today the house is still a family home in private ownership of the Rogers family.

The Riverhill estate include gardens, first established by John Rogers in 1842. The house and gardens are periodically open to the public. The huge <u>Turkey oak</u> at the front of the house was brought back as an acorn by a previous owner returning from the <u>Crimean War</u>. The garden also has <u>cedar</u> trees plated in the 1840s.

In March 2010 Riverhill House was the subject of a <u>Channel 4</u> television documentary presented by hotelier <u>Ruth Watson</u> as part of the <u>Country House</u> Rescue series. The documentary featured the current owner and director of the house Jane Margaret Rogers and leading maze designer Adrian Fisher.

Sheltie Champions And Their Ancestors

From 1915 up to 2008. Robert (Bob) Miller

Over the years I have built a file of all of the dogs behind American Sheltie Champions. This information is now available in a readily accessible booklet form for use by anyone to construct a pedigree or pedigrees for any of the included dogs in as great a depth as desired. The format I use is a listing of the dogs, their sires, and their dams in three columns across the page. Spiral bindings permit the booklets to open flat for convenient use. Included are all of the American and Canadian titles, the color, the sex, and (for American Champions) the year of finishing the championship.

Three volumes have been prepared. The first contains all of the AKC and CKC Sheltie Champions (and their sires and dams) through 2008 (15,000+ champions since the first in 1915). Since not all of the sires and/or dams (nor other ancestors) of champions are themselves champions, the second book contains similar information for the "Non-Champions" behind the "Champions" (22,000+). Together, these two books provide complete pedigrees for every champion (and for all of its ancestors) for as many generations as desired, ending with the (primarily) English imports.

A smaller third volume entitled **"Foreign" Shelties Behind Sheltie Champions** contains comparable information for the dogs (primarily English and Australian) behind the imports. This volume carries the pedigrees back to the origins of the breed (the founding lines and families).

With these books, one has the pedigrees of every champion and of all of the champion's ancestors along with colors and all AKC and CKC titles published at the time of printing.

Supplements to these volumes are issued essentially biennually, each supplement containing those earning a championship title since the last volume/supplement and the additional non-champions coming into the gene pool because of these new champions. Owners of these books are notified when the supplements become available.

A Crofter's Life in Shetland (clip 5) - A Crofter's Wife

An early documentary by filmmaker Jenny Gilbertson, one of Scotland's film pioneers. It records a traditional way of life which was about to disappear for ever and captures the annual farming year of the crofting communities of the Shetland Isles. The film features the islanders at work on their crofts, gathering peat, fishing and the celebrations during the "Up Helly Aa" festival.

In this clip we see the daily life of a Crofter's wife: sewing, washing outside and collecting peat. Look carefully to see her knitting whilst walking back with the peat basket on her back.

We took a tour bus to Johnson City. The tour group (Austin Assistance League and the Austin Senior Centre) knew mom was bringing a "guide dog" so the ladies saved me and mom the seat right behind the bus driver. Boy, were they surprised when mom's "guide dog" was a 10 pound sheltie 'GGGG' But it meant there was a seat there for Auntie Sandra too.

We started with a tour of the LBJ Ranch National Park and the Texas White House (only LBJ's office is currently open for tours). When mom got off the bus with me, about four different national park rangers each stopped her and told her that dogs weren't allowed. Each time, mom smiled and said I was a service dog (I don't know why these humans can't read the SERVICE DOG patch on my vest!) and they each just cratered. "Ah, she's so cute, can I pet her?" It serves to remind us however, that our sheep have grown during the last two hundred years to be very much larger than they previously were, and no doubt dogs were in proportion. In the Shetlands, the sheep are still very small, and they are managed by these excellent miniature Collies, which is what they really are'.

It was a pleasure to be invited to judge the puppies and dog classes at this well organised and friendly show and what an entry awaited me! My Thanks to everyone for making me feel so welcome. I came home with lovely gifts which I will treasure.

When I was first told of the numbers entered, I was surprised and then felt very flattered to think so many wished to bring their Shelties for me to see. I had to make the critiques smaller than I would have wished. This was the only way to get through the very big entry.

My thanks go to my Ring Secretary and Steward, Tarja Ihalainen and Uirpi Enroth, who kept the show going very smoothly.

I was rather sad to see that in some Shelties eyes are not the correct almond shape the standard calls for. This needs to be watched in your breeding programmes, although placement is correct, the eye was too full and a round eye does not give the expression we look for. On the plus side, I did find many with a good flat skull and good ear carriage. Also I was pleased with front and rear construction and especially reach of neck.

However, I was pleased to find nice Shelties and most were very well presented, some would have benefited by a little more trimming around the ears, this is all part of show presentation. Tail length was very good, and only two or three did not quite reach the hock.

All my winners moved well with good reach and drive.

In the Puppy classes, I found more promise in Bitches than the Dogs, but the winners of each class pleased me at this stage of their development.

BEST PUPPY - Blomlane's True Blue is good for size and is of good colour. I particularly liked his head and good underjaw, a balanced puppy who looked good in outline

BOS PUPPY - Huisin Summernight Sun is a delightful little lady, lovely golden sable who appealed for her sheer femininity. I hope both these two youngsters and others placed fulfil their promise.

BEST DOG - C.I.B FI & LV & EST MVA JV-07 GOLDEN ROSE PLAY WITH FIRE is a fine example of the Breed, masculine without coarseness, he moved around the ring with such an easy movement. He is a lovely tricolour with good tan. I was pleased when my co-judge made him Best in Show. It was very pleasing to be told after judging was finished, that he is the Sire of my Reserve Best Dog, how good to know he is passing on quality.

RESERVE BEST DOG - CC - RO MVA JMV-09 ROJV-09 PIKIKUINON BRAD PITT

I really liked this one too, both were very well presented and little separated them,

not an easy decision. They both have the balance and outline I look for with a typical outlook and good expression.

It was just the extra reach in front movement which won the day for Play With Fire.

FOURTH BEST DOG - RES CC SUNSWEET MOST HAPPY FELLA another quality golden sable and very little separated these last two. I just preferred the sweeter expression of Travelling Man.

The Veterans stole my heart I love oldies and they were a credit to their owners care.

BEST VETERAN BITCH AND BEST VETERAN C.I.B&FI&SE&EE&DK&LV<&BALT MVA WOODMIST MY FINE MORNING MIST. A very appealing golden sable, ultra feminine in outlook with lovely shape and balance.

This sighting had been on the previous Sunday, but the lady had not seen the poster regarding her disappearance until Thursday the 20th of May, four days later than when she had seen her on the Sunday night. This house backed onto the Hayward Scenic Reserve and firebreaks and tracks wound up and down the hillside and it is a very bush clad area.

More posters were put up around the area and door knocking which resulted in a reported sighting of her on the firebreaks in the reserve by a jogger who used the tracks for exercise. The man from the house where she had been seen eating the cat food decided on Saturday morning that he would go and have a look and see if he could see her. Well, he did, and called in that he had seen her five minutes ago on a firebreak some distance ahead of him. You can imagine how excited we got then.

As luck would have it David, my husband, was also looking in the same area having spent one and a half hours checking all the tracks there, and had decided to go up the same firebreak. When the other helper saw her, Morgan, ran off down the track and into the bush. David was coming up the same track whistling his special whistle that he does as he calls the dogs to go to bed at night. It will take her a bit of time to get over the fact that she doesn't have to hunt for food. I don't know what she had been eating, but boy there were a few smelly dog farts for a few days.

I want to thank all those people who hunted day after day looking for her. We all burned up a few tanks of petrol over the nearly 3 weeks she was missing. There were lots of tears of relief when the fantastic news of her being found safe and sound was told

Morgan is going to stay with us now, she has made her statement that she would rather be with us than with any other family so that is how it will be. There is no place like home.

CONFORMATION & PERFORMANCE EVENTS Can Your Sheltle Do Them At The Same Time?

Well, the answer is "YES" & "NO"!

The "yes" on the Shelties part comes because most Shelties do not have any trouble understanding the difference between the breed ring and performance events. First, the commands are different, the body posture of the handler/trainer is different, the equipment is different and the surroundings are different. These are all keys to the dog defining what is expected of them. If the dog seems to be confused, make a list of each command and body motion and under it write how the dog should respond. Next to that, record how the dog actually behaves. If these two columns are not the same, you have some homework to do to clarify your commands and body English to develop consistency with what you do and what you expect.

The answer "no" is based upon the fact that a dog cannot be in two different weights, and in different locations at the same time. Also, there are outside factors such as the size of one's pocketbook and number of vacation days. These are defining factors as to how much we can do with our Shelties.

The BIG determining factor is what you place as your FIRST priority.

What are your goals for each venue at a specific time? Goals may readily change with condition and coat of the dog and level of skills and their reliability, but you can only have ONE FIRST priority.

An example on one end of the spectrum would be to have the First Priority be preparing for a possible place on the AKC World Agility Team and attending a few conformation matches when you have a weekend free. This puts your emphasis on the performance side and your dog would probably be quite thin and muscled in a slightly different way than if he was only exercising on the flat. If your dog was close to the height limit for the World Team(s), you may have combed out the undercoat on its back and shoulders.

The opposite end of the spectrum would be having your dog in full coat and in good breed ring weight at an age that presents the dog closest to the standard. The dog would be well muscled but in a way to accentuate his gaiting including nice reach and drive. It would also be fully trained for breed ring requirements. The handler, whether owner or someone else, would have the ability to present the dog to its best advantage too. With the dog ready to win, it is shown where and when it will get a good look from the judges. From the performance angle, the dog can continue training if it is only going to shows on weekends and when ready, to compete in the performance venues. Keep in mind, though the dog can earn legs toward titles, it may not be in the type of condition needed in some venues to achieve its very best.

So, it would seem that despite the fact that our wonderful Sheltie can distinguish one type of required performance over another, there may be enough other opposing outside requirements that inhibit seeking top performances in both breed ring and performance venues at the very same time.



When Julie Desy evaluated Diva at nine months she said she liked her "frame" but she needed to mature... take her home train her in performance, have puppies and then bring her back for the breed ring. We did just that. Diva earned her AX, AXJ, OF and AD around a nice litter of six puppies. When she coated up and gained a little more than her agility weight she came out, handled by Julie, and finished in three weekends with 3 majors and a Group 2nd.

MISSING TOOTH SYNDROME

A fellow breeder asked what my view of the missing tooth syndrome was so I thought I'd share what I've observed. This breeder said that some dentists or breeders thought it was a female sex-linked gene. If so, that would make it what we call a holandric trait, like pattern baldness in men. I've not observed this at all, but I'm sure there are many more learned among you who may disagree with my theories and working observations, hopefully with better and more current scientific research information. And I'm not even going to get into the effects of the epigenome upon this trait. I'm going to try to explain it in as simple a manner as I can so more people will be able to go "AHA" and learn how to deal with it in a practical manner in their breeding programs in order to minimize it and eventually get rid of it entirely.

My research started many years ago when I did an outcross and ran into this syndrome for the first time. I acquired it from a full-mouthed male who was related to my stock. I looked for and found a series of articles written by two dentists who were also Corgi breeders, and these articles were published some 15 to 20 years ago in the Corgi Quarterly. Their theory was that it was a small polygene, autosomal in nature, and it defined an epistatic trait. Now, an epistatic trait basically means that it is an "on/off switch". The growth, dropping into place, shedding of milk teeth, growth of adult teeth, their dropping into place, are supposedly all governed by this small polygene complex. The normal interval (non-defective set) of growth and shedding means a full, normal mouth. We are not talking jaw issues here as those are separate factors. Just tooth growth/shedding. According to the theory put forth by these dentists, if the "switch" stays "on" for too long, you could get extra incisors. If it does not tell the baby teeth to shed soon enough or not at all, you can get "double" teeth where the baby tooth is retained, or you can get a lance canine. If the "switch" stays "off" at the wrong time, you can get missing teeth, whether incisors, canines, premolars or molars. I've seen all these stages. ALL these phases are controlled, according to this theory, by this epistatic polygene. Some lines may have only one or two genes within this polygene complex that are defective, or none at all, or some may have several defective genes in this little bundle. At least, this is the basis of the observational data.

There are also two precurors to this complex. If you have any of these signs, then you already have one or more defective genes in place, and it is easy to accumulate more without your knowledge until their impact is apparent. The first precursor you may see is that of uneven spacing. The upper and lower teeth along the sides of the mouth (premolars/molars) should line up like saw blades -- each tooth on each jaw is opposed by a space on the other jaw so that the serrations are even. When these spaces are not even and are mismatched, you've got one of the precursors. The second precursor is "popcorn" teeth which are very small and rounded. Another name is peg teeth as that is what they look like. They also quite often fall out early in the adult's life, another sign of the defect build-up. Ideally, you want big, strong, evenly spaced chompers who are gleaming white with minimal care and remain in the dog's head for it's full life. If you don't have this, at least pay attention and breed to it in order to gain back the proper dominants within this polygene.

Please note, tooth fairy judges, that tooth development is an entirely separate system of laying down/purging calcified material than that which the structural skeleton development entails. I say this because one of the common misconceptions among "tooth fairy" judges is that if a dog has missing teeth, then where is it also missing calcium/development in the rest of the skeleton and therefore a missing tooth is indicative of an overall defective dog. Please note these are different genetic systems that perform different jobs at different times. You can have a dog with a mouthful of missing teeth who has excellent hips, for example, or the reverse may be true.

Sometimes, in a small polygene complex, the initial or short term tracking of results can give the impression that it is either an autosomal dominant or a partially sex-linked recessive. A polygene is where a trait is made up of more than one simple dominant/co-dominant/recessive gene pair. In addition to being an epistatic (on/off) trait, this one is also an emergenic trait. Emergenic means that it emerges -- that you have to have more than one defective piece in place for the trait to be seen (to emerge). It is also called a "constellation" trait because, like a constellation in the sky, if you have, say, the handle of the Big Dipper, you won't have the trait. Or if you have the bowl of the Big Dipper, you also will not have it. But if you get the bowl and the handle together, bingo (another name for this phenomenon), you will get the trait. Or, in this case, the defective trait. These types of traits are almost always autosomal in nature. That is, they are carried on the regular chromosomes found in all cells in both dogs and bitches as opposed to the different sex X or Y chromosomes. Remember - a male carries a copy of both an X and Y sex chromosome while a bitch carries two copies of X chromosomes instead. Any male pup produced gets his Y chromosome from his sire and one X from his dam. A female pup gets one X chromosome from her sire and one X from her dam.

In my own experience, experimentation, and observation I've found this trait to seemingly operate autosomally. After all, when I picked it up, it was from a cross of a full-mouthed male to my full mouthed bitch and the pups who had it were both dogs and bitches. If it had been a single female sex-linked recessive gene then either a) the male I bred to wouldn't have had a full mouth, or b) none of the bitch pups would have been affected as they and male pups were. And if it were a single female sex-linked recessive gene, then any missing toothed bitch I bred, no matter how full the mouth of any dog I bred her to, would produce affected missing toothed males. Instead, what I've seen is that if you have pieces of this proposed

polygene, and they happen to come up snake eyes, the full Big Dipper, in the roll of the genetic dice, then you can get in it both sexes or none of the pups. And this has been the autosomal recurring pattern I've witnessed. Of course, if you see it pop up more and more in your stock, then that means that you've increased the gene frequency of that defective part in your stock, probably unknowingly picked up by outcrossing, and that trend generally won't correct until the stock is double bred back to clean stock. That's how you get rid of or at least significantly reduce the incidence of a defective polygene.

I'm sure others can give you far more scientific details about the latest genetic research. My aim is to give breeders something they can use in day to day breeding.

New Kennelclub rules

As from the 1st of July, the Dutch Kennelclub has prohibited breeding from the following combinations:

- a. Parent / child combinations (combinations of P generations / F1 generation)
- b. Brother / sister combinations (combination of F-generation)
- c. Grandparent / grandchild combinations (combination of F generation / F2 generation)

If breeders do not follow these rules, the Dutch Kennel Club has the following sanctions:

- a. reprehension
- b. fine of a maximum of €10.000
- c. temporary or permanent disqualification of the breeder/owner
- d. temporary or permanent disqualification of one or more of the dogs owned by the person not following these rules.
- e. deprivation of the right to hold a kennel name
- f. temporary or permanent deprivation of the right to act as a judge
- g. temporary or permanent deprivation of the right to act as an official

In Memory of a special little dog

On the 31st of May, we had to say a final goodbye to a remarkable little dog that had a big impact on the breed all over the world.

Frisbee was born in England with Mr. Bill & Mrs. Maureen Jackson (Faradale) and spent his first few months with them before being sold to Guy Jeavons and Mark McMillan of Grandgables Shelties – at that time- in South Africa. When they moved to Canada, Frisbee was one of the dogs they took with them. He was used a little bit by Canadian breeders, but Guy and Mark thought he could be of more use for European breeders, and so he came back to Europe in January 2000 shortly after gaining his Canadian champion title.

We showed him a little, but quickly found out this was not really something he liked to do, Despite his serious attempts to look his worst, he gained his Dutch, Luxembourg and International champion title to add to his Canadian and South African titles; after which we did not show him anymore.

While he might not have been the show dog we had hoped for, Frisbee made up for that as a stud, Many of his children did well at the shows and gained their champion titles, and many of them found their way into agility where they did well.

Many breeders across Europe have used him in their breeding program, and I don't know exactly how many champions he sired, but I do know he must be one of the very few dogs that sired champions on 4 continents (Africa, North America, Europe and Australia).

In his later years, he spent some time in Denmark and after that in Finland with our friends Aki and Pauliina Järvela; but no matter how much they would have loved to keep him, he had to come home again, as I had made a promise to his breeders about him staying here until the end of his life.

Frisbee had been doing well up until a few hours of his passing when he looked like he had a stroke. I rushed him to the vet where they quickly found out he had not had a stroke but was bleeding internally probably from a tumor in his spleen.

I had no other option than to let him go. Although, that was the hardest decision I ever had to make on such a short notice.

Frisbee was a wonderful companion and friend to us and the people who really got to know him, and we are sad he is gone, but proud to have been part of his life and the legacy he has left behind.

He might be gone but will for always be in our hearts

As I had been waiting my pup from Sunland kennels since 2006 I had an opportunity to monitor his life from birth, and he was 8 weeks of age when I made up my mind and decided to import him if he still looked promising at 6 months old. So in October 2008 all my dreams came true. Ranger had his 7 month birthday the day he arrived.

He had had a 30-hours flight via Bangkok and Copenhagen and he was super happy when I took him out of his crate at Helsinki airport. He was tired and hungry but very curious to see his new surroundings. Quite a difference between hot sunny Perth and snowy cold Kajaani! But he loved it all - snow and freezing weather - and settled in well. He especially enjoyed playing in the snow.

He had been shown a few times in Australia in puppy classes but he made his show debut in junior classes in Finland only two months after his arrival. It went well although he got only VG (Very good) from the Finnish judge. I showed him sparingly in spring 2009. He won his first CC in August 2009 at the Finnish Sheltie Speciality judged by Sheila Powell, Glensanda kennels, UK and he finished his champion title less than two weeks after his 2nd birthday in April 2010 at the Lappeenranta show judged by Mrs Päivi Eerola, Doing kennels, Finland. Mrs Eerola is a highly respected all-rounder and a true sheltie specialist in Finland so I'm very honoured to receive such a nice critique for him.

Ranger has already sired four litters in Finland and one in Sweden. The first two pups have already made their debuts in the show ring with great results as they both have 1 x CC. Both are my own breeding. I am so pleased - it's not often that you can buy a very nice dog that can also produce nice pups. I'm extremely grateful that Mrs Susan Van Dinter allowed me to have this lovely boy in 2008. I love Ranger truly, madly and deeply. Thank you!

Lure Coursing tries to stimulate the hound's natural instincts for coursing. The "Lure" (which is generally a plastic bag) is tied to a rope that is pulled around spindles and pulleys by a motorcycle especially designed for this purpose. The course pattern is irregular and somewhat similar to the way a hare might run in the open field.

Many breeds, not just sight hounds, participate in Lure Coursing in Queensland. The dogs are grouped together the same as they would be for a Conformation Show e.g. Group 5 Working Dogs. Crossbreds are also able to participate, however they cannot obtain Championship points. When being judged on speed, the judges naturally take into account that smaller dogs such as the sheltie cannot possibly run at the speed of a greyhound.

In brief the dogs are judged on:

- Enthusiasm: Are they lively, single minded, and showing great eagerness and determination with regard to the Lure?
- Follow: Do they chase the Lure with the intent of taking it while maintaining a path of reasonably close proximity to the lure's course?
- Speed: Rapidity in moving. Credit goes to the dog that levels out low, stretching and really driving.
- Agility: The ability to move quickly and easily, nimbleness in negotiating the terrain- turning without going wide or cutting corners and breaking stride, co-ordination of movement.
- Endurance: Lasting quality, stamina and mental concentration.

In an official Lure Field Trial the dogs are released on the Huntsmaster's call of "Tally Ho" and they follow the Lure around the course which can be up to 500 metres. Each dog has two runs in the day. There can be up to 100 dogs present. At the end of the day, prizes are awarded to the 1st, 2nd and 3rd placegetters in each breed, with the best scores out of a possible 200. Jazz on only her 2nd time at Lure Coursing scored 175/200.

Awards are given for Novice, Intermediate, Open, and Field Champion according to the score gained over a certain period of time. To gain the Title of Field Champion, an Open dog needs to score 170 points or more on three occasions over a 12 month period or 165 points or more on five occasions over a 24 month period.


To obtain the title of Lure Courser of Merit, Field Champions need (No time limit) 175 points or more on three occasions and 173 points or more on five occasions.

Some claim that this sport had it's origins in the UK, whilst others claim it was in British Columbia, nevertheless it was first seen in the early 1990's. Depending on where you live it is also known as Heelwork to Music and Canine Musical Freeestyle.

Simply put one trains one's dog to do a series of tricks or moves and you then choreograph your routine from the tricks and moves and perform it in time to music where you "dance together". The routine can involve heelwork, obedience and agility.

The selction of Music is important for the the breed of dog you are working with. For instance, a sheltie could perform to "Tijuana Taxi" or "Night Fever", but these pieces of music are too fast for a Rottweiler.

Dances with Dogs is now an approved canine sport with a recognised title through the Australian National Kennel Council. You can now be awarded qualifying certificates and gain titles in Dances with Dogs.

In each competition, competitors are scored in three categories:

- Routine content taking into account difficulty of moves, variation and teamwork.
- Technical Merit accuracy of moves, speed and willingness of the dog to perform
- Musical Interpretation- choreography and costume

Mary Ray of the U.K. has given a demonstration of Heelwork to Music in the Main Ring at Crufts on Best in Show Night for a number of years. I understand at least one demonstration was with a sheltie.

I trained with Panda, my bi-black sheltie, for some months in 2001, and he was on a 60 minute Dancing with Dogs programme in New Zealand in Sep. 2001. The routine in which we participated was set to "Hillbilly Rock, Hillbilly Roll". Sheila Marchant

Czech Republic Sheltie / Collie Club Show May 2010

I was delighted to receive the invitation to judge at the Sheltie Club show in the Czech Republic and looked forward to the event with great interest. I was told it was only a small show with entries of up to around 50 Shelties so was delighted to learn that the number of dogs entered was 64. In addition I would also be judging the Rough Collie puppy classes.

The May weather as we know had not been very "typical" and it was much the same in Prague. We arrived to a very dull and chilly reception which did not really improve for the 5 days we were there but at least we did not see any rain. We were met at the airport and taken to our hotel in Tabor the region where the show would be held, where room was very spacious and comfortable and after a very early start (we had left home at 2.30 am to catch an early flight) were happy to unpack and relax for a few hours to catch up on some lost sleep.

That evening the President of the club and his family took us to a traditional restaurant for a very enjoyable meal. It was here that we met my fellow judge Jean Paul Kerihuel from France. He was to judge the Rough and Smooth Collies. He had also bred Shelties in the past. Back at the hotel we sat chatting over an evening drink and then retired for the night.

The following morning we were met bright and early and taken to the showground a short drive away. It was located within a farm and the rings were nicely situated with seating all around in covered, tiered stands. It was a shame that the weather had not been good before the show making the rings very muddy, but at least on the day of the show it was dry so that was a bonus.

My judging began with the Collie puppies and then moved onto the Shelties.

I congratulate the exhibitors for managing to present the dogs in a relatively clean condition as it must have been very difficult for them. Muddy feet could not be avoided.

As it was quite a numerically high entry this enabled me to have sufficient dogs of excellent standard to take the top awards. I worked my way through the classes stopping midway for a very nice and welcome lunch.

My overall impression of the dogs was that size and balance on the whole was quite consistent. There were a few that were oversize and some that were really quite small. It is always important to remember the desired size called for in the standard and try to keep to it as closely as possible. That way we can achieve the correct substance for size and good overall balance more easily.

Heads were mainly correct and eye shape and placement good. Ears varied from correct neat well placed ears to quite large and heavy ears. Ears are so important in helping to create the correct Sheltie expression. Many would have been helped by careful, light trimming and I would encourage the exhibitors to practice doing this as it would make a big difference to the overall presentation. Likewise neatly trimmed feet and hocks give a far nicer finish to the legs.

Construction faults seem to be the same the world over with good angulation front and rear quite hard to get right. In order to achieve the desired smooth and reaching movement, good construction is essential. A good length of neck also gives the desired elegant and graceful outline and was present in all my top winners.

I was pleased that my Best of Breed had all these qualities and it was this that tipped the scales his way in the challenge against some shelties that had many typical attributes but could not match his movement. He also had a very nice head pattern and true breed type.

Many of the dogs were very uncomfortable on the table and I learned afterwards that they are frequently judged on the ground and a table is not used, so this would explain it.

I have judged in many different countries and each seems to have its own individual system. However, I have never had to give out so many CC's and reserves at one show. The Junior winners and second placings won Junior CC's and reserves, not unusual as other countries have Junior champions. What was different was that the winners of Intermediate, Open and Winners classes all received a CC and the 2nd places a res. CC. In addition to this there was a Club winner for each sex.

I did enjoy the experience and thank the exhibitors for their entry and the committee for looking after us so well. When it came to Best in Show I was very impressed with the Smooth Collie and so in agreement with my co judge it took top honours.



After the show we were taken to our hotel where we freshened up and, along with Jean Paul, enjoyed an exceptionally good evening meal in the restaurant before retiring for the night.

On Sunday we were met by Mlada Svobodova, a Sheltie breeder, and taken to her home one hour's drive away through the pretty Czech countryside. It was lovely to see her dogs and a bonus was that our Russian Champion Blenmerrow Borodin was on a visit to her so we had

lots of cuddles with him.

After a nice lunch and few hours talking Shelties and looking at books, Mlada kindly took us the hour's drive back to Prague where we spent two days sightseeing before returning home.

It was a privilege to judge at the show and a visit that I shall always remember, albeit that it was saddened by the loss of our Blenmerrow Barnaby in our absence.

Carting With Shelties In The USA

"No, I'm sorry your Sheltie is too small to pull a dog cart." This followed two years of fruitless attempts to get the only dog carting teacher I knew to let us learn. I was puzzled by this attitude as Cloud, my over-size Sheltie (17 1/2" at withers and weighing 28 lbs.) had won 6 sheep herding titles, and was cross training, for muscular development, by swimming weekly. He was in top athletic condition.

I found another teacher, who dubiously agreed to let us try carting. She said we had to go slowly so Cloud wouldn't be frightened. (I doubted he would as he bossed around large flocks of Dorset sheep, (each weighing around 300 pounds). He would have to pull a driving sulky which would clearly be too tall for him. We introduced him to the harness, then placed him between the shafts of the sulky, hooked him up to it, and we began walking. Success!

Cloud and I went all over the parking lot, up and down curbs, and pulled on grass and pavement. The trainer was amazed – said it was only the second time in her 15 years of teaching cart training that a dog was so accepting and took to it right away. The sulky was too tall, as the shafts went downhill to meet Cloud's harness. Cloud didn't seem to mind but I had to find a smaller cart (not a driving sulky) for him. I bought a cart made of PVC pipe. Cloud handled it easily but it is too heavy for smaller dogs to pull for any length of time. I knew I'd have to make my own carts.

Many months later, when I began teaching carting I smiled, thinking of my former teacher's comment, as I went through the same teaching procedure with Brownie, a confirmation sized Sheltie, using one of my lighter weight carts. He also took to it naturally - "You mean I get all kinds of praise AND a cookie for doing this?" I 'm not saying that all Shelties would willingly pull a cart, but our breed is talented and versatile and loves to work.

Cloud loves carting- when we go to public places people applaud and there are lots of "good dog" comments. He prances on egg shells, tail and head and ears are up as he responds to the crowd.

Several years after starting to cart with Cloud I trained other Shelties and made carts for them too.

I received permission from the American Shetland Sheepdog Association to demonstrate carting at the annual specialty, held in Tucson, Arizona on 3/16/10.

We had 6 shelties and carts from three states (California, Utah, and Pennsylvania). One dog is both blind and deaf but he loves to cart and proved that handicapped is just a word. The audience was astounded at the sight of those 6 dogs pulling carts and loving it as shown by dog heads held high, ears on alert and wagging tails.

Following the demo each of the carters discussed safety for the sport, including the use of a modified Siwash harness and buying a perfectly balanced cart. For more information on these topics please visit www.customdogcarts.com

"Tino" was born on February 24, 1995, in the German Kennel "vom Ohmtalteufel", owned by Beate & Udo Alexander. After looking at Sheltie photos, we became very interested in this breed. At that time, our country (Ukraine) was not sufficiently experienced in Shelties, and it was impossible to find a truly outstanding puppy.

We decided to seek help from foreign breeders, and a real connoisseur of the breed. By studying from cover to cover all the foreign magazines, we got enough information to allow us to get serious about selecting a puppy. We had visualized what we should look for in our Sheltie. It would be a male and a tricolour.

After reviewing several kennels in Western Europe, we stopped at the famous "vom Stormarner Land" in Germany. They have worked with Shelties since 1973. Erika Heintz, the owner, was a very pleasant person, and we relied on her extensive experience and expertise. (Erika is also a judge of the expert group 1 dogs of all breeds). Knowing that we wanted a show dog and a tricolour Sheltie, Erica looked for just such a puppy.

Then, two interesting matings occurred in kennel "vom Ohmtalteufel" - DjCh Janike vom Stormarner Land and Black Hair Lady of Golden Sunshine (Tery vom Locarnesse x Black Beauty vom Rodgauer See) were mated in Sweden. Our choice fell on Lady, in the past she had proved an excellent producer. The sire of the puppies was the very well-known Ch Shelgate Lucky Devil. At the time of mating, he was 11 years old, so we could not miss the opportunity to have a puppy from such a dog. After the puppies were born, one stood out for his charm. Beate and Udo even wanted to keep him in their kennel, but they had originally wanted to keep a bitch who became Vicky Black Angel vom Ohmtalteufel.

Now we had a problem with travel documents to Germany. We were refused a visa, and it would take a few months to correct the misunderstanding. Of course, the puppy could not wait. We and our friends from Germany were very upset hearing this. Our dream of this Sheltie had become impossible. Then we received word from Beate and Erica that the problem was solved. They had so kindly agreed to bring the puppy to Ukraine. In June of 1995, we had guests from Germany, and from that moment, we had our first Sheltie, our favourite, Tino.

Tino was just a lovely puppy. When he arrived he was about turned 4 months old. He was amazingly quiet and behaved with great dignity. He was the complete opposite of our collie puppies, who are constantly running and jumping, barking and playing with no rest. This character remained in Tino until his last day - quiet, reserved, dignified, ready by all means to attract attention, proud and at the same time compliant. He would not jump in and pull from your hand a titbit, but would come up and ask nicely or sit and wait to be summoned. He willingly performed commands. In every sense, he was a real Sheltie!

Tino developed very quickly, just as his father and grandfather, the famous Ch Deloraine Dog Star. In general, Tino is very like his grandfather - not only the appearance but also in nature, Tino was born exactly 20 years after the birth of his grandfather.

At 8 months, Tino was able to freely compete with older dogs, and at his first exhibition in Dnepropetrovsk (Eastern part of Ukraine) in 1995 he won the specialized exhibition Collie-Sheltie - Best in Show.

His further show career was very successful. He twice became the "Best of Breed - BOB" on the largest international exhibitions in Kiev. He first gained the necessary 4 x CAC receiving the title of "Champion of Ukraine". Later he received three such titles. Several times Tino became the winner of BEST IN SHOW all breeds. But the most resounding victory is the BEST IN SHOW at the biggest Sheltie show in Europe, SHELTIE SHOW IN GERMANY 1997. The exhibition had 136 shelties from 10 countries. The judging was carried out by Mr Guy Jeavons (Grandgables Kennel), who then lived in South Africa and now has moved to Canada, and Miss Sandra Taylor (Pepperhill Shelties, UK).



From 2003, Tino was exhibited in the veterans' class and had numerous wins in the Best in Show Veteran All Breeds! All the judges noted in their descriptions the excellent condition, excellent qualities, and added "is showing in a good mood!".



Tino was not used as a stud dog much, as there were not many shelties in CIS at that time. He still produced several Champions and Winners in Ukraine, Russia and Belarus, as well as he left his mark in Denmark during his short stay in the Kennel Shellove in 2000. The most successful offspring were the litters in Golden Key kennel (Belarus) where three became champions, in the Ukrainian kennels Shining Charm and Alkiona, in the Russian Tverskaja Skazka and Gentle Rose, in the Polish Moda na Success and couple of litters in our kennel, Lovely Funny.



April 18th 2010 Tino was gone ... but remains forever in our hearts as a Sheltie with a capital letter. He was our first and most beloved champion, who changed all our lives. Thank you, Tino!



He was totally balanced throughout, spot on for size, with just the right amount of bone and handled expertly to take this award.

The bitch CC was Shalreign KNLS Ch Shalreign Jump for Joy. She was a very glamorous golden sable with full white collar, beautifully constructed with soft expression, lovely bone and nice feet. In the challenge, I was splitting hairs, but the dog moved with such drive it just tipped the balance in his favour.

After all the classes, it was a run off between Dog and Bitch winners and also the baby puppies. We then went upstairs and all the trophies and gorgeous prizes were given. There were a few speeches and more lovely food. I was told many of the winners were related which did not surprise me when I looked at my final line up.

On reflection of the day, I found some lovely heads and I forgave a few round eyes because the construction was good. Short upper arms are still a problem and there was an odd missing tooth, but I found some good long tails. I was very happy with my final line up.

They must have been very tired because of travelling such great distance to the show. On Tuesday Kerrie took me to the National Rose Garden. There were lots of Roses in bloom, and it was a beautifully sunny day. I must just say a big Thank You to all the committee for giving me such a wonderful time with many memories and having the opportunity to go over such lovely dogs. It was a 50th Anniversary show to be really proud of.


